Dangerously high arsenic levels, found in local drinking water.

Earlier this month, we told you about the Terrell's.

A South Lubbock family who found arsenic in their water and their bodies.

And we now know they're not alone.

Jason Terrell blame's his family dog's sickness on the high levels of arsenic in her drinking water.

So Texas Tech Researchers tested well water in North, South, East and West Lubbock County and found mixed results.

The arsenic tests found concentrations greater than 10 parts per billion in some areas, between two and ten in some and below two parts per billion in others.

"I think it should be a concern a health concern for people that are their water is testing above ten but especially get up to 20, 50, 60 parts per billion then yeah I think it is a concern for their health," said Dr. Steve Presley, The Institute of Environmental and Human Health.

The EPA recommends no more than 10 parts per billion in water.

If you use well water, experts suggest you purify it before you drink it.
